

The Wister Award of The American Daffodil Society

The American Daffodil Society recognizes outstanding garden daffodils with the Wister Award. Criteria for this award are:

1. That the cultivar must be a good grower. It should have a floriferous habit (many bloom stalks).
2. It should have long lasting bloom with clean color, showy at a distance and reasonably sunfast.
3. Foliage should be vigorous, resistant to disease and frost damage.
4. Stem should be taller than foliage, strong and sturdy.
5. Bulb should be resistant to basal rot and not prone to splitting up. (Too rapid increase can be a problem, such as in a cultivar where the blooms deteriorate dramatically in size and substance after being down two or three years.)
6. Emphasis should be on garden performance, although it may be of show table quality.
7. Cultivar should be readily available.
8. The award may be given annually.

The following daffodils (Narcissus) have received that award:

1. **‘Stratosphere’**, 7 Y-O, a yellow and orange jonquil hybrid, several blooms per stem, 1985 (Sources: 2, 3, 4, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16)
2. **‘Accent’**, 2 W-P, a white and pink large-cupped daffodil, **1987** (Sources: 2, 4, 9, 11, 16)
3. **‘Ice Follies’**, 2 W-W, a white large-cupped daffodil which opens with a yellow cup, **1992** (Sources: 1, 2, 4, 9, 11, 13, 16)
4. **‘Sweetness’**, 7 Y-Y, an all yellow, fragrant jonquil hybrid, **1993** (Sources: 1, 2, 4, 9, 13)
5. **‘Ceylon’**, 2 Y-O, a yellow and orange large-cupped daffodil, **1994** (Sources: 2, 11, 13, 16)
6. **‘Salome’**, 2 W-PPY, a white and pink large-cupped daffodil with a yellow rim on the cup, **1995** (Sources: 1, 2, 11, 13, 16)
7. **‘Peeping Tom’**, 6 Y-Y, a yellow cyclamineus hybrid daffodil, **1996** (Sources: 1, 13, 16)

8. **'Rapture'**, 6 Y-Y, an all yellow cyclamineus hybrid daffodil, **1997** (Sources: 2, 4, 7, 12, 14, 15)
9. **'Intrigue'**, 7 Y-W, a jonquil hybrid with yellow petals and a white cup, several blooms per stem, **1998** (Sources: 1, 2, 4, 9, 12, 13)
10. **'Tripartite'**, 11a Y-Y, a split-corona hybrid, with several blooms per stem, **1999** (Sources: 1, 2, 4, 7, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 16)
11. **'Monal'**, 2 Y-R, a yellow and red large-cupped daffodil, **2000** (Sources: 1, 2, 9)
12. **'Golden Aura'**, 2 Y-Y, an all yellow large-cupped daffodil, **2001** (Sources: 3, 4, 12, 13)
13. **'Bravoure'**, 1 W-Y, a strong-growing trumpet daffodil with white petals and a yellow cup, **2002**. (Sources: 2, 3, 4, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 16)
14. **'Tahiti'**, 4 Y-O, a yellow and orange double daffodil, strong stems, **2003**. (Sources: 2, 4, 9, 11, 13, 16)
15. **'Segovia'** 3 W-Y, a miniature daffodil, **2004** (Sources: 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 11, 14, 15, 16)
16. **'Fragrant Rose'**, 2 W-GPP, a later blooming pink and white large-cupped daffodil with perfect form, **2005** (Sources: 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 14, 16)
17. **'Dainty Miss'**, 7 W-GWW, intermediate-size all white flower, **2006** (Sources: 9)
18. **'Camelot'**, 2 Y-Y, all yellow large-cupped daffodil, **2007** (Sources: 4, 13)
19. **'Chromacolor'**, 2 W-P, a white and ink large-cupped daffodil, **2007** (Sources: 2, 11, 16)

20. **'Hillstar'**, 7 YYW-YWW, a jonquil hybrid with a white halo on the yellow petals and yellow at the base of the white cup, several blooms per stem, **2007** (Sources: 2, 4, 9, 12, 16)
21. **'Merlin'**, 3 W-YYR, a small-cupped daffodil with white petals, and a yellow cup rimmed in red, **2007** (Sources: 2, 4, 13, 14, 16)
22. **'Quail'**, 7 Y-Y, an all yellow jonquil hybrid, several blooms per stem, fragrant, **2007** (Sources: 2, 4, 11, 13, 16)
23. **'Falconet'** 8 Y-R, a tazetta hybrid with yellow petals and a small red cup, several blooms per stem, **2007** (Sources: 2, 4, 11, 13, 16)
24. **'Kokopelli'**, 7 Y-Y, an all yellow jonquil hybrid with several small blooms per stem, **2007** (Sources: 2, 4, 6, 7, 11, 12, 15)
25. **'Saint Keverne'**, 2 Y-Y, an all yellow large-cupped daffodil, **2007** (Sources: 2, 4, 13)
26. **'Resplendent'**, 2 Y-R, a red and yellow large-cupped daffodil, **2007** (Sources: 3, 6, 10)
27. **'Brackenhurst'**, 2 Y-O, a red and yellow large-cupped daffodil, **2008** (Sources: 11, 13)
28. **'Hawera'**, 5 Y-Y, a miniature yellow triandrus hybrid with several blooms per stem, **2008**. (Sources: 1, 2, 4, 9, 11, 13, 14, 16)
29. **'Crackington'**, 4 Y-O, a yellow and orange double daffodil, **2009** (Sources: 4, 7, 15)
